Extension office at 6:30 p.m. on Tuesday, July 19, 2016 with 13 members and
one guest present. President Jamie Walters brought the meeting to order.



Milkweed seedlings can be started indoors in a greenhouse or under artificial lighting and then transplanted outdoors after the average date of last frost. If seeds are started indoors, allow 4-8 weeks growing time before transplanting. Plastic flats can be used to start the seeds. To allow for natural stratification, sow collected seeds directly into a mulched bed in the fall and the seed will germinate the following spring.
